It is one step away from Architecture." And although she is qualified in her field, she is well aware that she has to keep on learning in order to stay on top of her game, "My speciality is in Interior Design and Construction, which means I always have to know what is going on in the industry. Styles and colours are constantly changing so I have to keep up with the trends."
